Together we keep the Mass as the center of our worshiping community. All those who volunteer for liturgical ministries witness to the presence of Christ in our midst and strengthen us as a community centered on Jesus present in the Eucharist and in his living Word.

Within our liturgical ministries, we rely upon the gifts of the presider to lead us in worship, and the gifts of God's people to sing his praises, proclaim his Word, serve at his altar, welcome his people, care for his altar and his house, and assist in the distribution of Holy Communion, at Mass and to the homebound. There are many ministries and many gifts needed to support the liturgy in our parish.

We continue to encourage all members of St. Bernadette to participate fully, consciously, and actively in our liturgical worship and the life of our parish.

Altar Servers

Mission: A unique ministry by which boys and girls fourth grade and older can help to spread the word and the love of Christ by assisting the principal celebrant during Mass. Hospitality: Greeters

The role of a greeter is different from an usher, who works inside the church helping people to find seats and facilitates the flow of the collection(s) and Communion procession. The greeter is at the door, helping people in, giving them liturgy sheets. This ministry could be the most effective means of helping all to feel welcome, coming to Mass on Sundays and other special liturgies.

Mission: Welcome all parishioners and

visitors to Mass with a warm smile and friendly greeting. Some greeters could stand outside and assist people who need assistance from their car to their pew. Distribute liturgy sheets and assist ushers as needed. Adults and teens welcome.

Time: Weekly commitment desired, not required (arrive 15 minutes prior to Mass). Schedule is flexible and finding a substitute is required. Initial training and annual meeting.

Hospitality: Ushers

ECHO: Ecumenical Community **Helping Others**

ECHO is a non-profit, all-volunteer private agency whose purpose is to help people in need in our community. Since 1968 when it first started ECHO's base of support has been religious congregations in Burke and Springfield. Those congregations appoint members to ECHO's board of directors and support its mission with donations of food, clothing, money, and work by volunteers.

Saint Bernadette is one of the ECHO board member congregations. Through congregational donations as well as civic groups, charitable foundations and individuals ECHO is able to help needy people.

Mission: : Assist people with food, clothing, household items, and financial assistance who suffer the effects of long-term poverty as well as people who are experiencing an emergency need.

Time: This varies depending on what you volunteer to do at/thru ECHO, as much or as little as you can spare.

Talent: Sort clothes, cashier, pick-up and deliver furniture. Ability to interact with applicants seeking financial assistance. Friendly demeanor and compassion for those in need of help.

Fairfax Prison Aftercare Ministry is a multi-denominational Christian program coordinated by Truro Church, working in cooperation with the Chaplains at the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. Its purpose is to assist inmates at the Center to improve their opportunities to grow spiritually, to access available resources in the community and to build more constructive lives following their release from prison. Inmates accepted into the program will not have had a conviction for a violent crime.

Mission: To bring the redeeming and transforming love of Jesus Christ to men and women incarcerated, and to remain with them for spiritual support upon their release, by pairing an individual care giver to a care receiver and by supporting care givers through corporate prayer and education.

Time: Completion of an eight-part training course. Attend monthly meetings at Truro Church in Fairfax.

Talent: Adults 21 years of age or older with an intentional prayer and discernment leading to a call to participate in this ministry. Commitment to be paired with a care receiver—men with men, women with women upon completion of training. Acceptance of accountability, help and support in all care giving experiences, including when necessary, intervention of clergy.
