from the pastor

Dear Good People of Saint Bernadette,

Football really isn't something I can spend a lot of time on. I used to keep up, but after five years in the seminary (when we couldn't have a TV), then two years newly ordained (without a television), and two years in the Dominican Republic (no electricity), when I went back to football it just seemed like too much to start over.

As you know, I'm from Kansas City and I do enjoy games later in the season and have had a lot of opportunities to root for one particular home team in playoff situations. After the game last Saturday night I called my brother Bob and talked about the game for a while. It was a good game. He warned me not to go online or social media, though: he said the haters were out of control.

I see this as a metaphor for many of our problems today. I think it is one thing, and natural, to root for the underdog. But it is becoming more and more common (and natural?) to hate the winner. I blame social media combined with human weakness for this growing trend of hatred. It is the product of our lack of self-control which the internet's anonymity permits.

Apparently after a homily I gave recently speaking about the problem of division we have in our country and our Church I was spoken badly about for preaching politics in the pulpit. Topics like division, immigration and caring for poor people are not political issues. They are moral indicators of who we are as a people. It takes two to divide, remember.

The division we see in every place in our world doesn't have its source in religion or Jesus. We all know who is the author of lies and division, and Jesus spent a good part of his public life casting out our demons.

We must stand for what we believe and, in that way we should be a leaven for the world. Our message should provide a balance, not a division. How do we learn to do this?

I am on the steering committee for an ecumenical forum called Christian Churches Together. We just had our committee meeting week before last. CCT is a relatively new conference of church families, founded on the principle of

receptive ecumenism, that is to say, on the *necessity* to truly listen and hear, or *receive*, what each other has to say. It requires a respectful openness to another person and what they have to say. Civil discussion can follow, if desired. Agreement is not required, nor is consensus. The opposite of reception is exclusion.

It is not as simple or easy as it might sound. It is a discipline (same word root as disciple) that is not valued so much today, it seems.

Over the years I have been a confessor for several orders of women religious, and there is something that they would confess that I have never heard with lay peoples' confessions. They would confess that they failed to "cut short," that is to say, they didn't hold back what immediately came to mind and said something that they regretted saying. In a moment of disagreement, especially when you have already judged the other person to be wrong, words can hurt, and divide.

Jesus said we should not judge, unless we be judged. We will be judged by the same measure by which we measure others. Consider his words: there is an equalizing reality to them. How many world tragedies have come from one people judging another people to be inferior, even less than human? Deep hatred can result.

We have to be the solution, and stop the cycle of hate. It is a middle ground between not giving it your attention but not ignoring it. When my brothers and I would drive each other crazy my mom would tell us to just ignore him and he will go away. Experience has taught me that this is not the solution, either.

Be the solution. Counter hate with love, loving kindness. Another thing she used to tell us was that we had to love everyone, but we didn't necessarily have to like them.

There were two games last Sunday. The first one was rough, often hard to watch, I thought. Hatred was palpable and plays sometimes resulted in fistfights. But that is what happens in football, you get tackled. In the second game however, in stark contrast with the first, when someone tackled an opponent, he often bent down and gave him a hand up to get back on his feet.

Mass and healing prayer service February 25

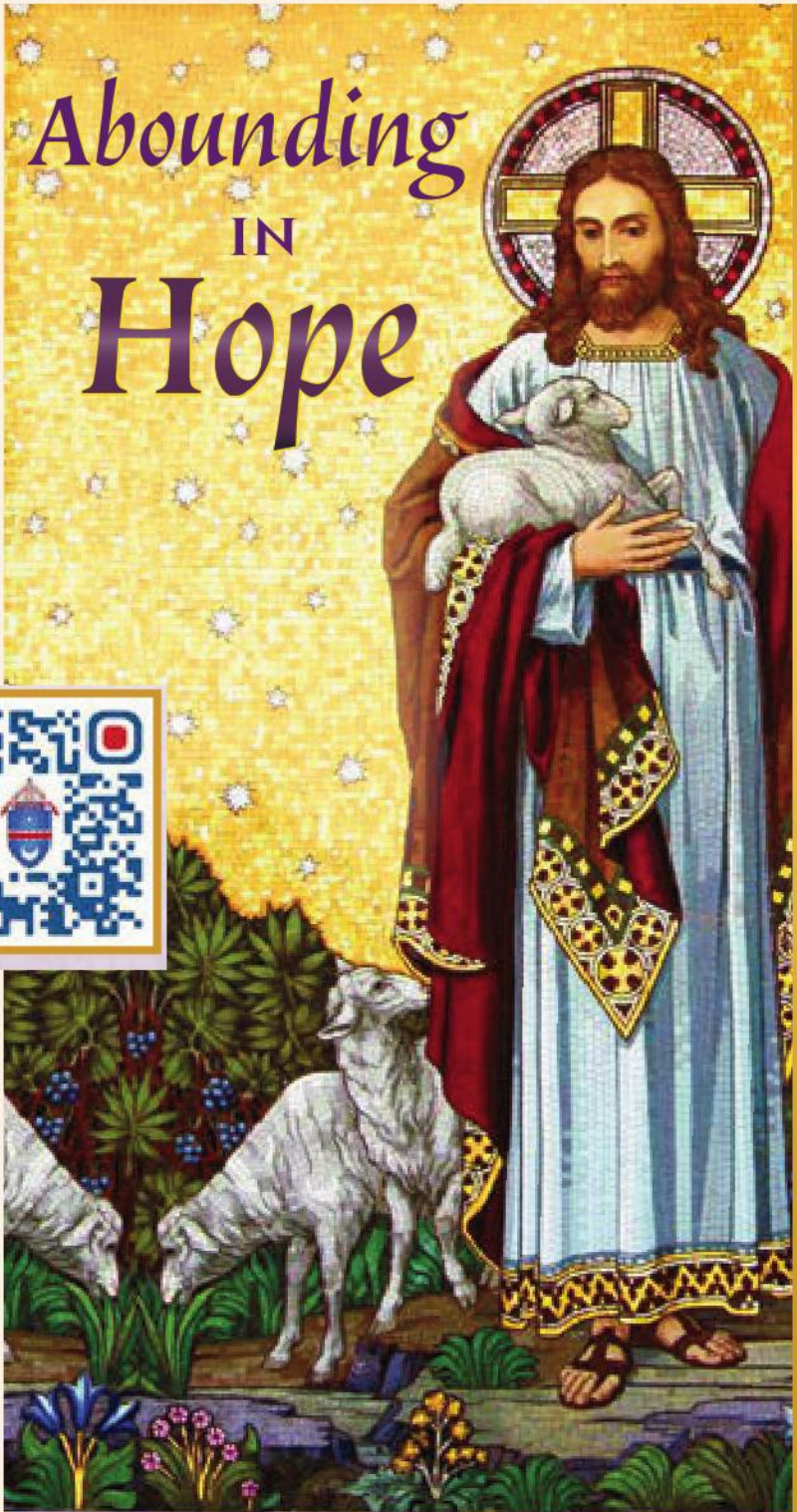

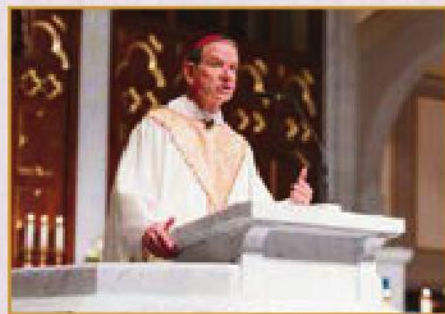
