
BLESSING *and* DISMISSAL

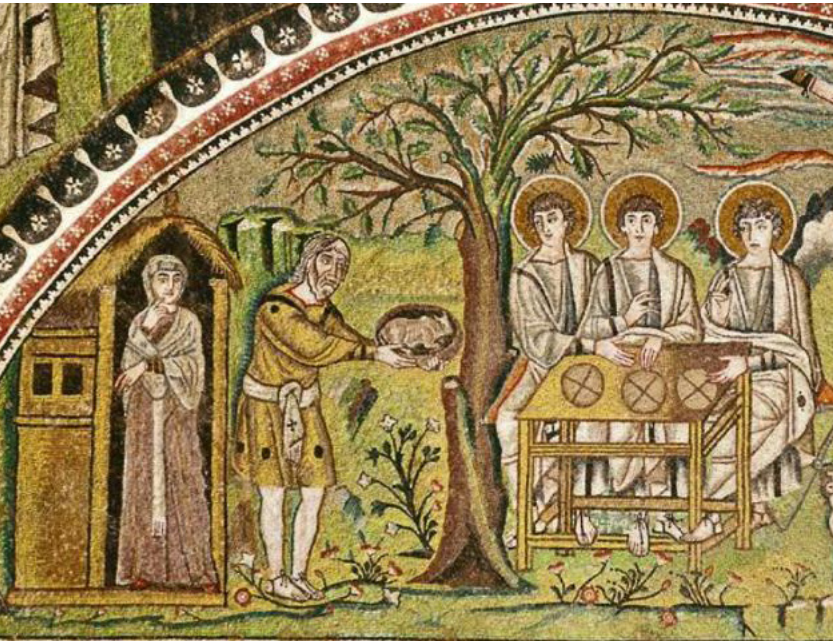
