Dear Good People of Saint Bernadette,

Last Thursday, November 20, I attended an "Early Thanksgiving Feast" hosted by the American Turkish Friendship Association. They hosted the event at the community center next to St. Leo the Great Parish in Fairfax City, and representatives from churches, synagogues, mosques and temples across northern Virginia were represented at the program and delicious meal. If anyone ever offers you Turkish honey cake, do not turn them down!

Seven religious leaders started the evening with prayers of thanksgiving. I was the first. I started with comments that Saint Thomas Aquinas taught that religion is a practical part of the virtue of justice -- regardless of what our religion is, we have a duty to return praise and thanks to the One who has given us life and all our gifts to his glory. This is what I prayed:

God our Creator, we give thanks to you, who alone have the power to impart the breath of life as you form each of us in your image and likeness.

Grant that we, whom you have made stewards of creation, may remain faithful to this sacred trust and constant in safeguarding the dignity of every human person, indeed, all your creation.

It is truly right and just, our duty and our salvation, always and everywhere to give you thanks, holy and eternal God.

For, although you have no need of our praise, yet our thanksgiving is itself your gift, since our praises add nothing to your greatness, but profit us for salvation.

Let our gratitude overflow this evening, thank you, God. Despite the brokenness of our world, our nation. Despite the deep suffering of people from needless wars of cruel aggression. Make our thanksgiving as a people to be a catalyst for change, in prayer and in action. Bring security and consolation to those who have lost so much, loved ones, homes, even their own lives. Convert the hearts of those who cause such division and tragedy in our world.

Finally, fill our fellowship and our diversity with your blessing tonight. Bless the food we

enjoy, the hands that prepared and provided it. Transform our thanks into blessing for our wider community as a source of unity and peace. Touch each of our hearts with a sense of the urgency of what we do, and make us instruments of compassion, reconciliation, and joy. We ask this in your holy Name. Amen.

It struck me, as the other religious leaders came forward for their prayer of thanksgiving, that we were all praying for exactly the same things. Christians, Jews, Muslims, Hindus, Latter Day Saints, Ba'hais. At the end the moderator for the evening said what we were all thinking. Although our religions might be very different, our thanksgiving was exactly the same. This was the subject of the talk I gave in Taiwan this past summer. Regardless of the ritual tradition, the reality of the human being in relationship with the Divine is the same for everyone. Our hopes, needs, desires, petitions, and thanksgiving are the same.

I offer this as a reflection for this Thanksgiving holiday weekend. So often we gather around the holiday table and the tension in the room is palpable, we are so divided by so many things. Maybe we could focus on our diversity not as division, but from a perspective of more dimensions. It is by our differences that we can come to learn to listen and know empathy, and only then our gratitude that we discover for each other can be the healing that is so needed in our world today.

I had an earlier than normal deadline for this bulletin and our Thanksgiving Interfaith Service hasn't happened yet as I write this, but I am hoping we will find this truth not only in prayer, but also in action together as a wider community. We are all seeking -- those of us who are seekers -- for the same thing, a relationship that transcends the limitations of this life into the life beyond this world, with its many expressions and cultural understandings.

May gratitude be your starting point and principle of action in the days to come. May we be deeply grateful for the many things we often take for granted.



a letter to our school alumni Fr. Don



Dear Alumni of Saint Bernadette School,

Greetings from your Saint Bernadette community!

My name is Fr. Don Rooney and I've been pastor at Saint Bernadette since 2016. Since coming here, I have been pleasantly surprised by the number of people I meet in successful, meaningful careers who say, "Wow. I went to St. B's!"

One of the first things we did after I became pastor was to realize some necessary, major maintenance projects and expand Wisdom Hall, putting a new front on the school, adding much-needed admin offices and a conference room.

The parish is now in the process of finally building a parish hall on the front of the old convent/current parish offices with the meeting spaces that we have needed literally since the beginning of the parish. Without space, community and outreach just can't happen. We hope to break ground within 18 months.

I'm reaching out to you at this time to ask if you would consider helping us with one very important project in the school. Of course, in the first half of the 65 years our school has been here, people didn't think as much about handicap accessibility. Today it is inexcusable not to be accessible, but our school still isn't. If children with special physical needs apply at Saint Bernadette we must turn them away, unable to make the necessary accommodation for them. And then there are faculty and staff who sometimes are less mobile and kids that get broken bones.

We need an elevator and I wonder if you, our alumni, would take this on as your **project.** It isn't my intention to turn this into an annual appeal – we already have the Cardinals Care fund - but I think a great way to get this over the finish line is your help.

I hope your time here at Saint Bernadette was a happy one, and perhaps you could express your satisfaction and thanks for the good learning foundation that set you on your course. Also, if you could, please send this letter to three other alumni letting them know about this initiative. I'm told the cost of an elevator is about \$350K. With soft costs and contingency I'd like to set a goal of \$500,000. We will see.

You are always welcome to contact me, I love hearing stories of how our school helped so many families these 65 years. Or you can contact our Administrative Assistant, Jean Corday, with your replies. Thanks, and God bless you. Saint Bernadette, pray for us!

Stewardship resources and reminders: reduce your taxable income!

If you are 70 1/2 and over, consider using your IRA for a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD). If you are 73 and over, consider using some or all of a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) as gifts to Saint Bernadette. This is an easy way to reduce your taxable income and benefit the parish. Contact Rick Caporali at or Linda Patterson at the parish office.

Charitable giving update: legislative changes for 2026 and beyond

Charitable giving under new legislation includes a new universal deduction for non-itemizers and a floor for itemized deductions, alongside corporate and high-income taxpayer impacts. Giving is encouraged by allowing non-itemizers to deduct cash donations up to \$1,000 (single) or \$2,000 (jointly), but it also introduces a 0.5% AGI floor for itemized deductions, caps benefits at 35% for high-income taxpayers, and imposes a 1% income floor for corporate giving.

For Individual Donors: Universal Deduction for Cash Contributions Starting in 2026, non-itemizers can deduct cash donations up to \$1,000 (single) or \$2,000 (married filing jointly).

Itemized Deductions: Individuals who itemize will now only receive a deduction for charitable contributions that exceed 0.5% of their adjusted gross income (AGI).

High Income Taxpayer Cap: The tax benefit for itemized deductions for wealthy donors will be capped at a 35% marginal rate, regardless of their actual tax bracket.

Ineligible Donations: This new universal deduction for non-itemizers does not apply to gifts made to donor-advised funds or private non-operating foundations. The universal deduction is expected to significantly increase participation in charitable giving, as it extends tax benefits to the approximately 90% of taxpayers who do not currently itemize deductions.

Planned giving: make a gift of appreciated assets

Consider a gift of stock or any other appreciated asset as a donation to Saint Bernadette Catholic Church and School. In exchange for a gift of a long-term appreciated asset, you can receive an income tax deduction for the current market value and avoid capital gains taxes on that appreciation. Your gift will support the Church, School, or the parish hall Capital Campaign.

Remember us in your will or trust


